Borrowing

All the members of the University have borrowing rights when they register in the library's system. There are different borrowing rights depending on the user category. An academic identity card is required.

Prevention of plagiarism

Faculty members are supported with the use of the Turnitin software, an effective tool to compare texts in order to ascertain the originality of students' papers and to prevent plagiarism or the erroneous use of sources.

Library Seminars

Together with the faculty, seminars are organized to present the correct use of services provided and of printed and digital material. The seminars include guidelines for writing a paper.

Events

Events are organized regularly to inform and present various topics of general, scientific and cultural interest, sight-seeing, book presentations, workshops, etc.
